Any Ways and Means and Appropriations bills that were still "alive" at the end of the 2017 Legislative Session are still eligible for consideration now. Yellow highlights are changes from the previous week. (Note: A bill that is "dead" can be brought back later in the Session by leadership or through the Appropriations or Ways and Means Committees. No bill is really dead until the final gavel falls.)
