## **Budget Items**

#### 2024 RIIF Appropriations

The FY 24 RIIF budget provides funding from the Rebuild Iowa Infrastructure Fund and the Technology Reinvestment Fund to provide funding for vertical infrastructure projects. The FY 24 budget allocates \$181.2 million in funding, outlined in **SF 577**. The following allocations and of importance are included:

#### 2024 Agriculture and Natural Resources Appropriations

The FY 24 Agriculture and Natural Resources budget provides \$43.54 million in funding to state entities involved with agriculture, natural resources, and environmental protection, as outlined in **SF 558**. #### New language related to Ground Water Protection Fund (Division II, Sec. 8):

Sec. 8. Section 455E.11, subsection 2, paragraph b, 8 subparagraph (2), subparagraph division (a), Code 2023, is 9 amended to read as follows: Thirty-five percent is appropriated annually to the lowa nutrient research fund created in section 466B.46. Of the moneys appropriated pursuant to this subparagraph division, five hundred thousand dollars or one-third of the moneys appropriated, whichever is higher, shall be deposited in the water quality initiative fund created in section 466B.45 for purposes of supporting the water quality initiative administered by the division of soil conservation and water quality as provided in section 466B.42.

#### Floodplain Management and Dam Safety (Division II, Sec. 12.1):

- a. For purposes of supporting floodplain management and dam safety:
- b. Of the amount appropriated in this subsection, up to \$400,000 may be used by the department to acquire or install stream gages for purposes of tracking and predicting flood events and for compiling necessary data to improve flood frequency analysis.

#### Conservation Reserve Enhancement Program (Division V, Sec. 17.1):

- a. For the conservation reserve enhancement program to restore and construct wetlands for the purposes of intercepting tile line runoff, reducing nutrient loss, improving water quality, and enhancing agricultural production practices: [\$1,000,000]
- b. Not more than 10 percent of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "a" may be used for costs of administration and 16 implementation of soil and water conservation practices.
- c. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the department may use moneys appropriated in this subsection, in combination with other appropriate environment first fund appropriations, for cost sharing to match United States department of agriculture, natural resources conservation service, wetlands reserve enhancement program (WREP) funding available to Iowa.

#### Soil and Water Conservation (Division V, Sec. 17.4):

- d. Of the amount appropriated in paragraph "c" that the department allocates to a soil and water conservation district, the first \$15,000 may be expended by the district for the purpose of providing financial incentives under section 161A.73 to establish management practices for the control of soil erosion on land that is row-cropped, including but not limited to nontill planting, ridge-till planting, and contouring strip-cropping. Of any remaining amount of that appropriation allocated by the department to a district, 30 percent may be expended by the district for that same purpose.
- f. Of the moneys appropriated in paragraph "c", 5 percent shall be allocated for financial incentives to establish practices to protect watersheds above publicly owned lakes of the state from soil erosion and sediment as provided in section 5 161A.73.
