ACTION >>>>>

Putting the new strategic plan into action is helping IEC deliver on its goals and vision.

Board leaders and staff finalized the Council's strategic plan in spring 2022. The plan retains the original purpose and goals of the organization, while weaving in new areas of focus for IEC such as environmental justice, climate change, and corporate accountability. Both climate change and environmental justice are root causes of many environmental challenges we face in lowa.

Our work to improve and protect lowa's water quality and land use continues. Our efforts to grow renewable energy use and rapidly advance the electrification transition remain a priority. Our process for educating and engaging lowans endures, as does our focus on utilizing policy to advance solutions. We continue to embrace our unique role as a legal watchdog and legislative advocate at the state level. Our new strategic plan encourages us to address these priorities more holistically, working together in areas of overlap, listening to and empowering new voices, and considering partnerships with new types of funders.

Staff are now turning this vision into action, building relationships and convening coalitions to address challenging issues. We are excited about new grants to support this vision, along with generous support from lowans across the state who are part of our growing movement for change. In 2023, we anticipate visiting more lowa communities, building new and strengthening existing partnerships, enhancing our resources, and so much more.

lowa utilizes 100% clean electricity by 2035.

Push MidAmerican to commit to coal retirements by 2030.

Reaching 100% clean energy in lowa is key to realizing IEC's vision of a sustainable future for all lowans. In 2022, two communities joined Des Moines in the call for 24/7 100% carbon-free electricity: Waterloo and Windsor Heights. These resolutions demonstrate lowans' desires to address climate change. Our state continues to lead the way nationally and globally in the transition to clean energy.

IEC continued to push the state's regulatory agency to hold MidAmerican Energy to account for its plans to burn coal until 2050. Leveraging our partnerships, legal firepower, and expert testimony, IEC made its case against MidAmerican Energy with regulators

at the Iowa Utilities Board in dockets throughout 2022. We demonstrated that the utility could save customers millions by investing in more affordable renewable projects while shutting down expensive coal generation. We continue to make the case for MidAmerican to show its work when it comes to its coal use and planning.

IEC and partners are also elevating the discussion in the public space. Clean Up MidAm, a coalition-based corporate accountability campaign, ramped up efforts in 2022. The project has featured television commercials, guest columns and op-eds, educational webinars and resources on renewables and grid reliability, and more.

The campaign is having an impact; we see it in the utilities' messages to customers and how executives are responding.

Even as we push for coal plant closures, we remain concerned about the impacts to local economies and workers. Building on our 2021 coal community impact analysis, in 2022 we played a key role in developing the lowa chapter of the Blue Green Alliance. This labor and environmental partnership seeks to ensure that good-paying clean energy jobs benefit lowa workers and that projects are environmentally sound. In 2023, we will work to make state agencies, local leaders, and others aware of federal funding opportunities for these communities, and that equity is a key consideration as funding is utilized across the state.

lowa's water quality has improved and lowa's land and communities are better prepared for climate change impacts.



ACTION >>>>>

Advocate for effective rules to protect water quality and increase accountability in public spending.



lowa touts its initiatives to address water pollution, control the negative impacts of animal feeding operations, and continue to "feed the world." In reality, many of those efforts lack appropriate rules and timelines or are simply not enforced. In 2022, IEC sought to address pollution from animal feeding operations (AFOs) by petitioning for rulemaking with the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Current rules allow AFOs to be sited without consideration for sensitive landscapes, or thought for drinking water sources. Additionally, IEC found that construction of AFOs in the 100-year floodplain has continued even after this was prohibited by law in 2003, simply because the DNR never adopted an official floodplain map! The DNR has drafted new rules in response to IEC's petitions. We hope to see those rules adopted and enforced in 2023.

As IEC continues to call for accountability around the current Nutrient Reduction Strategy (NRS), we are also working to strengthen it. In August, the Council published a report noting the lack of measurable progress from the NRS and offering seven recommendations for improvement as lowa's NRS approaches 10 years of implementation. An IEC report published in July makes recommendations to improve water quality monitoring in lowa to better coordinate efforts and ensure responsible use of public dollars.

IEC also continues to call on leaders at the Capitol to do their part. From funding the Natural Resources and Outdoor Recreation Trust Fund, to empowering the DNR by fully staffing the agency, to passing laws that truly ensure good stewardship of lowa's natural resources, elected leaders have a responsibility to address the issues lowans have made clear they care about. IEC is inviting more lowans to participate in those conversations with engaging videos, easy but effective action alerts, and more.

lowans of all backgrounds feel welcomed to inform and engage with the work of the lowa Environmental Council.

Building on the action plan developed in 2020 and 2021, IEC staff and leaders continued to work to ensure equity and justice considerations are at the center of everything we do as an organization, and especially in the diverse coalition partners we cultivate. In 2022, we prioritized expanding our relationships through new outreach in local communities, new organizational partnerships, event sponsorships, and support for diverse vendors.

IEC was pleased for the first time to sign on as a sponsor of the 2022 lowa Juneteenth celebration in Des Moines, in addition to our ongoing sponsorships of the Latino Film Festival in Des Moines and Proteus's I'm Thankful for a Farmworker event.

Diverse lowans from across the state have shared their time, stories, and knowledge with IEC, and we are so thankful for their voices. In 2022, several social and racial justice leaders shared their stories in guest blog posts. Members of the Meskwaki Nation shared their tribe's history and vision for land stewardship at IEC's Organizational Member retreat in April. In May, we hosted a gathering at Drake University for lowans to share stories, photographs, and reflections on the connections between water pollution, climate change, and justice.

In 2022, IEC was awarded a grant to assist state and local entities, businesses, and individuals benefit from federal funding opportunities presented by the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and the Inflation Reduction Act. The Justice40 Initiative is a key part of this funding, and IEC staff are working to ensure the money is utilized and distributed equitably and that traditionally underserved or marginalized communities can take advantage of opportunities available. This work led to the December launch

of the Iowa Federal Funding & Infrastructure Hub, a comprehensive website providing information, key dates, and more. Staff will continue to share information and engage communities throughout 2023 to ensure the funds benefit all Iowans.

The Iowa Environmental Council partners with unexpected and impactful organizations, engaging with Iowans all across the state.

Coalitions hold unique power in advocacy work, bringing together sometimes seemingly disparate voices to call for solutions that benefit all involved. Partnerships were key to several IEC initiatives in 2022. The Clean Up MidAm coalition officially launched in March. IEC was part of the founding conversations for the lowa chapter of the Blue Green Alliance, and the Council convened a new coalition of partners to address AFO pollution in Iowa.

Many of these coalition partners are also Organizational Members of IEC, and the number of businesses, non-profits, and organizations aligning with IEC continues to grow.

IEC sought to further expand and diversify our supporters through outreach in 2022. From our first-ever Council event in Storm Lake, to our Clean Water Act 50th Anniversary celebration in Davenport, we made new connections in a range of communities across the state. These opportunities to connect are valuable, providing context and color to our work in legal filings, meetings with state agencies, conversations at the Capitol, and the myriad places we engage in this work.

Through expanded coalitions and outreach, IEC and partners are driving the call for change.

We developed further connections with community members and leaders, professionals, educators, and more at presentations and events across lowa. IEC staff provided valued insight at a variety of professional events in 2022, such as renewable siting panel discussions through the University of lowa's Hubbell Environmental Law Initiative, water quality presentations at the Upper Mississippi River Conference, and policy solutions at Common Good lowa's inaugural Policy Wise Summit.

IEC made new friends participating in Earth Day events around the state, and connected with new supporters with our Community Village booth at the 80/35 music festival in Des Moines. The Council continues to seek new ways to meet interested lowans and looks forward to more events and engagement in 2023.

ACTION >>>>>

New fundraising efforts coupled with passionate donors help IEC meet and exceed fundraising goals.

On the heels of a successful 2021, IEC leadership and staff set their sights on a new fundraising goal in 2022. IEC members and supporters hosted six house parties in communities all across the state, introducing their circles to the work of the Council. IEC continued to offer hybrid options for major fundraisers Pro H2O and Environmental Mixology. The Wild & Scenic Film Festival brought together more than 50 fans of film and the environment in person for the first time since the event was launched, while our inaugural Green Gala & Art Auction raised the fundraising bar and engaged new supporters at a delightfully 'green' event.

Several unique donation opportunities helped IEC engage in new work with new audiences. The Council was challenged in 2022 to raise \$25,000 to receive a matching gift to support our water program work, which the organization achieved thanks to donor support! A new private donor supported efforts to promote clean energy opportunities for rural communities from the Inflation Reduction Act.



Unaudited




