

It's Day One of Iowa's 2020 Legislative Session

Today, legislators return to their chambers for the second year of the two-year biennium. This means any bills still 'alive' after the first year of the biennium remain active and can be picked up starting day one of this session. New bills will also be introduced and will be required to pass through 'funnels' and committee hearings. We anticipate that we will see action on some bills much sooner than the previous year.



Republicans have a new Speaker of the House, Representative Pat Grassley. As Speaker, Grassley will have the power to set the House's agenda and to work with the Republicancontrolled Senate led by Republican Senator Jack Whitver. The 2020 session will mark the fourth year in a row that Republicans control the House of Representatives, the Senate, and the governor's office.

On Tuesday, Governor Reynolds will deliver the 2020 Condition of the State Address to a joint session of the legislature. The address serves as the announcement of the administration's formal legislative proposals.
